As I reflect on 2025, I am proud to say that First Tee – Greater Richmond continues the outstanding work fulfilling our mission that we have done for 28 years. This past year, we reached 73,151 young people across Greater Richmond, up from 36 participants when we started in 1999. That number tells a story of relentless growth, deepening community roots, and an unwavering commitment to our mission. Our First Tee Program enrolled 3,042 participants across our three facilities, offered 124 classes and camps, and expanded our community partnerships to reach 707 additional youth through organizations like the Boys and Girls Clubs of Metro Richmond, Anna Julia Cooper School, Jacob’s Chance, Cristo Rey, and more. Perhaps most importantly, 68% of our participants received full financial aid in 2025, paying nothing to access life-changing programs. That is what your support makes possible.


This past year also marked an important milestone at our first facility. The renovation of our Tattersall Youth Development Center in Chesterfield is complete. One of the first facilities ever established in the First Tee network, Tattersall has been the home of our mission for 28 years. Now, reimagined and renewed through our Courses That Build Character Campaign, it stands as a bold statement

of what we believe: that our young people deserve welcoming and inclusive spaces to grow, learn, and thrive.

None of this happens without you. To our sponsors, donors, volunteers, coaches, and community partners – your investment in First Tee – Greater Richmond is changing lives far beyond the course. Every dollar, every hour, every moment of support reaches a young person who is learning not just how to play golf, but how to set goals, resolve conflict, grow through challenge, and lead with integrity.

For ten years (2016-2025), the PGA TOUR Champions Dominion Energy Charity Classic brought world-class golf to Richmond, Virginia, and First Tee – Greater Richmond was proud to be a partner. This past October marked the final year of this tournament and as we reflect on what this partnership has meant, we are filled with gratitude for the PGA TOUR, Dominion Energy, and the Country Club of Virginia.

Over the course of ten years, this partnership opened doors we could not have opened alone. Each April, the Country Club of Virginia welcomed and hosted our Community Invitational tournament, one of our signature fundraising events for First Tee – Greater Richmond. In addition, together with the PGA TOUR, we took meaningful strides toward making golf more diverse, inclusive, and accessible. Through the River City Collegiate Classic and the Dominion Energy Charity Classic Skills Challenge, we partnered with HBCUs from across the region to introduce a new generation of young golfers to the game and the opportunities it can create.

Henrico County Public Schools

The event brought together 56 students representing 14 elementary schools from across the district. Participants demonstrated the golf and life skills they developed during their First Tee School Program and on-course field trips while competing in a spirited and supportive environment. Community Partners

June 30, 2025

New in 2025, First Tee – Greater Richmond expanded the Champions Day tradition by hosting a special event for community partners on Monday, June 30th at the Elson Redmond Memorial Driving Range. The event welcomed 50 participants representing several partner organizations, including Peter Paul RVA, The Salvation Army Red Shield Youth Center of Richmond, and Richmond Parks and Recreation. The gathering provided youth from these programs with a chance to experience the same celebration and competition that school-based participants enjoy, further strengthening the partnerships that expand First Tee's reach throughout the community.

The event featured 80 students representing 20 elementary schools across the district. 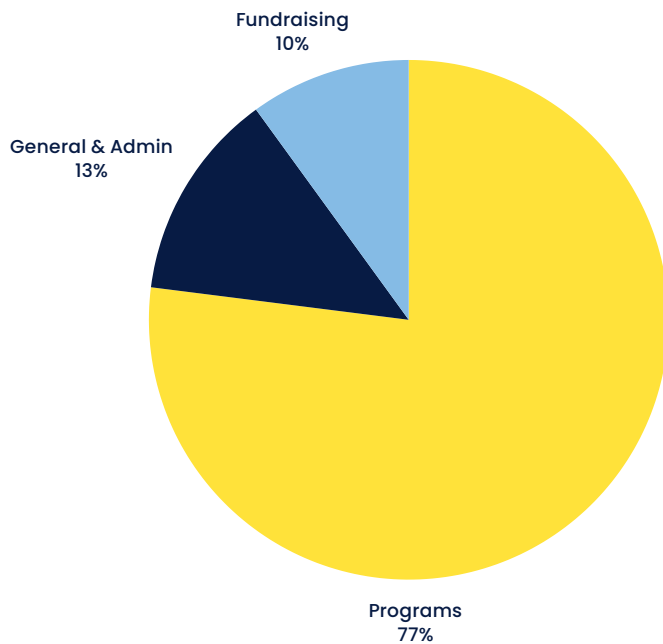

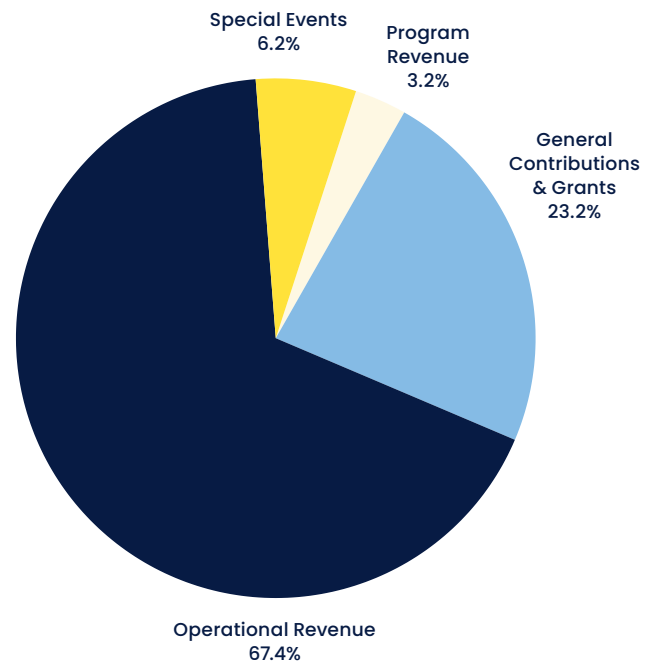

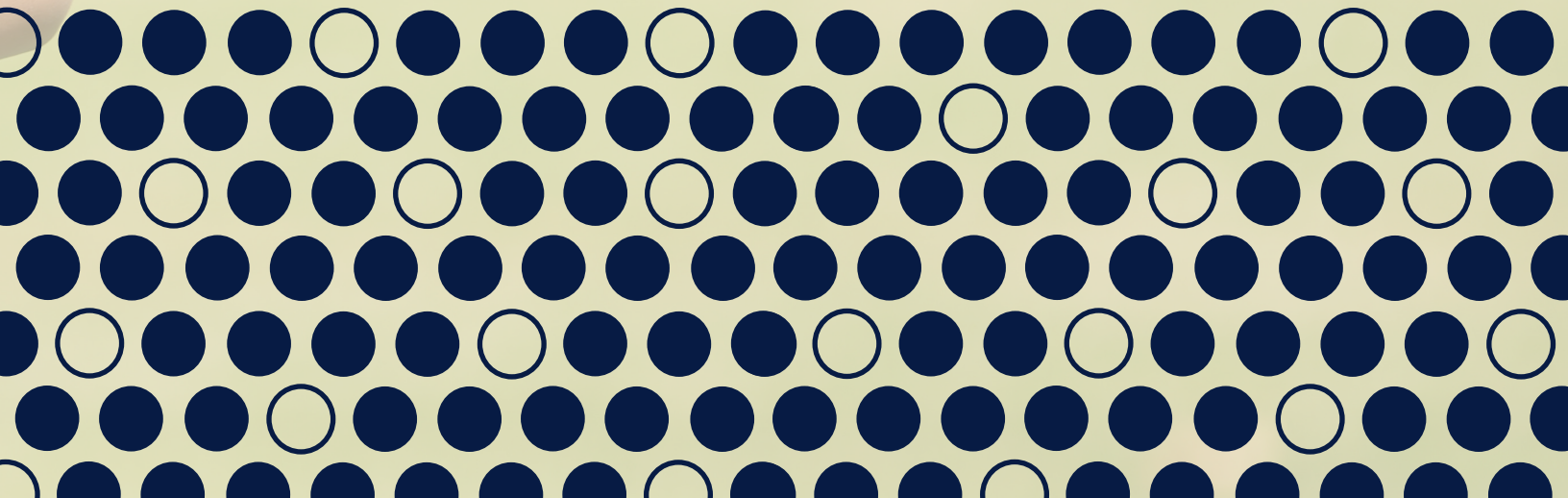
